- Are there pre-requisites for the courses I want to take? Pre-requisites are requirements you need before you take a course.
 - Grade Level (Juniors and Seniors only)
 - Previous Course Requirement (Art 1 before Art 2)
 - Teacher Recommendations
 - Auditions (Band, Chorus, Orchestra, Guitar)

EARNING COLLEGE CREDIT

- Concurrent Enrollment allows qualified high school students to take college courses at NOVA or the college/university while enrolled in high school to earn college credit and possibly receive high school credit for these courses. <u>Form IS-158</u> and the specific NOVA, college/university forms must be completed/approved prior to registration.
- Dual Enrollment Courses taught at the high school by an FCPS teacher and offer college credit through agreements with NOVA or a college/university. Speak with your counselor if you want to learn more about this option and the registration process.
- Dual Enrollment Courses Offered at CVHS English 12, Geospatial Analysis, Latin 4, Multivariable Calculus/Matrix Algebra, Biology 2 DE, US Government DE, and Entrepreneurship. Other Dual Enrolled courses available at the academy and Online Campus.
