



## STANDARD / HONORS

## ENGLISH 9

### English 9 students will

- Read a variety of literary and nonfiction genres, focusing on analysis and character study
- Develop their writing skills for a variety of purposes and audiences
- Improve their skill in reading, writing, vocabulary development, and knowledge of correct grammar and mechanics
- Receive support as they develop critical thinking skills they can apply to communicating their ideas

## ENGLISH 9 HONORS

The same skills are taught in all levels of English 9, however, to be successful in an honors class, students should:

- Be successful in their 8th grade English class
- Be prepared for an <u>increased workload</u> with out-of-class reading and writing assignments
- Enjoy reading and possess strong reading comprehension skills
- Be <u>strong writers</u> in terms of organization, style, grammar, usage, and mechanics
- Have a <u>mature attitude toward their studies</u> and a strong work ethic, as they will receive challenging assignments (research paper v. product, timed writings, etc.)

## 9th SOCIAL STUDIES COURSES

#### **WORLD HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY 1**

- Covers Prehistory (~2,500,000 BCE) to the European Renaissance (~1500 CE)
- Students study the relationship between the geography and history of Europe, Africa, Asia, and the Americas
- Students complete three writing assignments throughout the year to receive SOL credit
- Prepares students for World History & Geography II and World History & Geography II Honors

## 9th SOCIAL STUDIES COURSES

#### WORLD HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY 1 HONORS

- Covers same time period as the standard course
- Students complete three writing assignments throughout the year to receive SOL credit
- More rigorous workload: requires independent work outside of class
- Writing intensive (essay or project-based assessments)
- Requires a dedicated work ethic and strong background in reading, writing, and time management skills
- Focuses on developing and refining high-level critical thinking skills
- Prepares students for AP World History and World History & Geography II Honors

## 9th GRADE MATH FAQs

### What comes after Algebra 2?

Choices: Trig/Discrete, Probability/Statistics, AP Statistics, Pre-Calculus, Calculus

#### Can a student skip a course?

No

#### Can a student take a new class over the summer?

Yes, only if they had a high school math course in middle school. Online and self-directed (not recommended for Alg 2).

## BIOLOGY

- Lab science course
- Follows VA SOLs and FCPS POS benchmarks
  - Explore the understanding of living systems within our world.
  - Students will investigate: biochemical life processes, cellular organization, mechanisms of inheritance, relationships among organisms, and changes of organisms over time.
- All students enrolled in Biology will take the Biology SOL at the end of the course (May).

## BIOLOGY HONORS

- Covers same concepts as the standard course, will explore concepts more in depth.
  - ► Follows VA SOLs and FCPS POS benchmarks
  - Lab science
- More rigorous workload: requires independent work outside of class.
- Requires a strong work ethic and background in reading, writing, and time management skills.
  - ► Formal lab reports (1 per quarter)
- Focuses on developing and refining high-level critical thinking skills.
- Independent Research Project (IRP) is required
  - Inquiry research and experimentation
  - ▶ Worth 5% of overall final course grade.
- <u>All</u> students enrolled in Honors Biology will take the **Biology** SOL at the end of the course (May).

# EXPUNGING MIDDLE SCHOOL GRADES

- To expunge a high school math or World Language grade/credit from your student's permanent transcript you need to notify the middle school during the school year or the high school after the school year ends.
- Students have until the end of the first nine weeks of their freshman year to request to have a grade expunged.
- Form IS-104 is available at the middle school and high school or online.
- Once a course has been expunged it cannot be reinstated.

# SUMMER COURSES TAKEN OUTSIDE FCPS

- Students who wish to pursue summer coursework outside of FCPS for credit must have prior written approval from the high school Director of Student Services.
- Courses taken at private schools must be approved by VCPE.org
- Form IS-158 must be submitted and approved prior to registering for the course.

## **REGISTRATION PROCESS**

- Registration information is presented to 8<sup>th</sup> grade students and parents.
- Middle School Counselors will meet with 8<sup>th</sup> grade students to register for classes.
- Parents should review course selections.
- Master Schedule is based on selections by <u>March 6th</u> choose wisely!
- Be sure to select at least 2 alternate courses in order of preference.
- Course selections will be visible immediately in your SIS Student and Parent Vue Accounts by mid March (please review).
- Electives and Level Changes will be considered until June 14<sup>th</sup> if space is available. Contact your middle school counselor to request changes.
- Schedules are created over the summer.
