

EARNING COLLEGE CREDIT

- Concurrent Enrollment allows qualified high school students to take college courses at NOVA or the college/university while enrolled in high school to earn college credit and possibly receive high school credit for these courses. <u>Form IS-158</u> and the specific NOVA, college/university forms must be completed/approved prior to registration.
- Dual Enrollment Courses taught at the high school by an FCPS teacher and offer college credit through agreements with NOVA or a college/university. Speak with your counselor if you want to learn more about this option and the registration process.
- Dual Enrollment Courses Offered at CVHS English 12, Biology, Chemistry, Government, Geospatial Analysis, Geospatial Analysis 2, Latin 4, and Entrepreneurship.
- Other Dual Enrolled courses available at the academy and Online Campus.



- Master schedule is based on selections by mid March choose wisely!
- Electives and level changes will be considered until June 6th if space is available.
- Schedules are created in June/July/August.
- Schedules will be given out at the Wildcat Welcome in August.

COURSE SELECTION CONSIDERATIONS

- Balance! Make sure you have time for class requirements and time for extracurricular activities, work, family and friends!
- Challenging yourself. Where are your interests? Is it time to take an Honors or AP class?
- Teacher feedback and suggestions
- Choose wisely! Don't select classes based on who is teaching the course or what your friends are taking.
- Classes fill quickly. Class changes AFTER registration has closed may not be possible.

SCHEDULING/ COURSE SELECTION TIMELINE

- Students enter draft course selections into Student Vue on January 16th
 - Backup electives are important!
- Students meet with their counselor between 1/21- 2/28
- After meeting with your counselor, course selections are locked and can only be corrected through an email to your counselor by March 12th
- Freeze for staffing decisions 3/13- 4/20
- Changes from 4/20 to 6/6 are allowed on a space available basis
- As of June 6th, all course selections are FINAL
