<u>STEM Youth Development Internship</u> – event date Jan. 14-April 2, 2023 - high school students ages 16+ will be able to develop and practice professional skills at the Children's Science Center Lab. <u>Latina SciGirls Internship</u> – event date Spring 2023 - showcases STEM learning in Latinas through the incorporation of hands-on activities, multi-media tools, and exposure to accomplished Latina STEM mentors.
